The funding from the Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Fisheries of Denmark for this call is under the auspices of the Board of the “Green Development and Demonstration Programme” (GUDP) and is administered by the Danish Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Fisheries.

GUDP is a funding programme that aims to motivate and promote ambitious, innovative activities focussing on the green transition of the Danish agriculture, fisheries and food sector and therefore shall meet the needs of the respective industries.

Projects are subject to the rules and regulations of GUDP as specified in GUDPs general national guidelines.

Submission of an **additional questionnaire** together with the full-proposal is mandatory for Danish participant. **The Danish project participant has to send the questionnaire directly to the Danish contact person (gudp@lbst.dk).**

Additional information:

For Danish participants, the rules of GUDP prevail, but the international application- and budget templates have to be used <https://www.agroecologypartnership.eu/>.

A questionnaire concerning the project’s relevance for Denmark has to be send to GUDP (gudp@lbst.dk) in case the project is invited to the full proposal stage. Only in case of granted funding, a budget scheme including a Gantt chart for the Danish part of the work, and participant datasheets have to be submitted. The material can be found [here](#).

Applications for funding can be submitted by:

- Large, medium and small size enterprises (incl. other stakeholders such as independent institutions, private research organizations, and owners, tenants and users of farms)
- Research and other public knowledge institutes
- Technical Service Institutes (GTS) – are classified as companies
- Non-profit organizations

Funding from GUDP cannot be granted directly to foreign institutions or businesses registered outside of Denmark. However, those may participate as an external consultant to a Danish applicant.
