Regarding cultivation of GM crops in Denmark

The Danish Agricultural Agency hereby confirms that currently no genetically modified plants, including seeds and potatoes, have been approved for marketing for commercial cultivation in Denmark.

Accordingly, commercial seed production or cultivation of genetically modified crops is not allowed in Denmark.

This is also the situation for most of the other EU member states, except the member states that are cultivating the genetically modified maize Mon810, which has been approved for cultivation in their geographical area.

Denmark is a party to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety. Therefore, the Danish Agricultural Agency would be notified if seed of a GM crop were to be sent from a third country outside the EU to Denmark.
